It will be necessary to limit to a strict minimum the number of SADC-PF delegates, which could be made up of two parliamentarians, supported by the Forum.  Therefore, participation should be done on a rotational basis.

In accordance with a recommendation included in the mandate of the Forum's Regional Commission for the Supervision of Parliamentary Model Laws (RPMLOC), can the 56th Plenary Assembly be informed whether a contact person in the Parliament has been appointed to assist the Commission in monitoring the transposition of the Model Laws adopted by the Forum?
